

Turkish Drama... a Deceitful Plan and a Poisoned Arrow into the Minds of Muslims!!

It was not just a deceitful plan that the "New Ottomans" prepared to fill the world's satellites with the false history of the Ottoman Turkey. As they poached a huge number of intellectuals, media professionals and Arab celebrities to be a bridge for the Turks towards their Arab and Islamic societies, and to be a forefront for the new Ottoman colonial project.

The influence of Turkish drama in its Arab and Islamic surroundings is apparent

and direct in its employment to build an unreal image for the Ottoman State and its historical symbols, and to market the notion of the so-called "caliphate" again into the conscience of the recipients. It revealed in that report the time line of Turkish drama and how it infiltrated into the Arab mind starting from the year (2007) through "The Rose Wreath," series, which was the first Turkish series dubbed in Arabic. Further, it pointed out that before this date there had been no significant presence of this type of Turkish drama. The success achieved by that romantic series served to be a starting point in attracting the attention of Arab viewers to follow such a kind of non-Arab drama works, which later spread in a record time like an "Epidemic". report revealed how Turkish series deliberately presented open-minded scenarios and scenes of romantic relationships, pregnancy outside of marriage, marital infidelities and the classes of secular society in Turkey. Turkish series into Arabic and Islamic languages and dialects, for instance - Urdu. This led some Muslim peoples to believe in the Turkish view about its Sultans and their lives. Another thing that the Turks published and succeeded in doing so, was the portrayal of their country as a civilized and developed country that has a growing economy through the visual glamour, and the selected views and footage, which was not a spontaneous behavior. The dramas that dealt with the history of the Ottomans attempted to falsify the facts and replace them with fabricated ideas and stories in order to present the Ottomans as an image of faithful nobles. In contrast, they were murderers that killed, displaced, and enslaved millions of the afflicted peoples who were destined to fall
